Grade: 1	Strand: Reading	Concept: draw three pictures using Appleworks 6 to retell a simple story. Pictures will be arranged in sequence to create a simple slide show.
Description of Task:	Beginning, Middle, End Slideshow Students will read a story. Using Appleworks 6 Draw Tools, they will create a simple slide show, by drawing an event that occurs at the beginning, middle and end of the story.

Student Instructions: (for teacher)	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Open Beginning, Middle, End Slideshow template. 2. If the Controls window is not visible, go to Window in menu. Select Show Presentation Controls. 3. Double click on slide number one in Controls and use the draw and fill tools to complete the slide. This is a picture from the beginning of your story. 4. Move to slide number two in Controls. Complete the activity on slide number two. This is a picture from the middle of your story. 5. Double click on slide number three and complete the activity. This is a picture from the end of your story. 6. To play Slide Show, go to Window, Slide Show. 7. To print go to File, Print. 	
Teacher Notes:	See Student Instructions. Students should have had lots of exploration time with the program, experimenting with the draw and fill tools before this activity. Students may add text to Slideshow. Related offline activities: Integration opportunities available with Visual Arts curriculum, as the students are producing two- dimensional works of art that communicate ideas.
